



**Selective waste sorting facilities** are available to residents of the Cité universitaire de Genève, organized as follows:

### Waste Sorting Organization by Building

#### ► Building A

- On each floor, kitchens are equipped with sorting bins for:
  - PET
  - Glass
  - Aluminum / tinplate (steel)
- On each floor, a designated area is available for cardboard disposal. Cardboard must be flattened and free of staples and tape.
- **Household waste** must be disposed of in the designated containers located in the parking area of Building A.



#### ► Buildings C and D

- **A sorting room is located on the ground floor of each building.**

Additionally, a **container for batteries** is available at Reception.

### Important Tips for Proper Waste Sorting

- **Glass:** Only dispose of containers that have been rinsed beforehand to prevent bad odors and dirt in the containers (e.g., sauce or soup jars).
- **PET:** Remember to remove the air from bottles before disposing of them.
- **Aluminum / tinplate:** Aluminum can be mixed with tinplate or steel cans (e.g., tuna cans, food cans).
- **Paper and cardboard:** Only newspapers and small cardboard packaging (e.g., cereal boxes, yogurt packaging) are accepted. Pizza boxes must not be placed in the cardboard bins and should be disposed of in the outdoor containers.



- **Household waste** must be disposed of in the designated containers located in the parking area of Building D.

**Important:**

For all packaging, please check the recycling logo before placing items in the appropriate bin.

Large cardboard boxes from electronic or electrical equipment or postal deliveries (computers, printers, lamps, etc.) must be flattened, cut into pieces, and placed in the designated cardboard sorting area.

**Room trash bins must be emptied regularly by residents into the outdoor containers.**

Kitchen bins are intended for household use only.

Used clothing can be deposited in the “Boîte à Fringues” (clothing donation box) of the cooperative, located in the parking area of Building A.

In collaboration with <https://laptitepoubelleverte.ch>, Reception also provides composting facilities for **organic and plant waste**. The regular disposal of these wastes is the sole responsibility of residents.

Aluminum coffee capsules and organic waste can be disposed of at the **recycling point located behind Building A**.

**RECYCLERIE**

Thanks to donations from departing residents, we have set up a recyclerie (reuse center). This allows new residents to reuse dishes, kitchen utensils, and various everyday items as part of an anti-waste initiative.

These items are available free of charge; however, availability depends entirely on the number of donations received.

Bed linen, bath linen, food, furniture, and suitcases are not collected.
